From the Desk of the President

Continuous change in the world is inevitable. And it is happening even right now. Though change can sometimes be uncomfortable, it can also bring improvements through new thought processes and ideas. At Share & Care, we value this evolution and encourage and adopt change throughout the work we do. The results are seen in the way we operate and generate resources, how we decide on projects, and how we select partner organizations to undertake our projects.

In 2018, we also made a strong commitment to the next generation for leadership, project screening, and to mobilize fundraising. By 2020, our goal is to have all the necessary pieces — and talent — in place to finalize the transformation. We put the process into motion earlier this year, and will continue to build on it until we reach our goal.

In spring, young leaders at your foundation organized a fantastic 5K walk/run to raise awareness about our various projects. The event raised over \$70,000 and many young people volunteered for the causes we advocate. We made great headway in embracing the next generation, and had a fun-filled half a day. As Share & Care's core group is aging, this new, resourceful generation has become Morning Rising sun for all of us.

In January, we decided to celebrate Mahatma Gandhiji and Kasturbaji's 150th birthdays along with the 100th year of Sabarmati Ashram by building a project around their core values. Our team included people from the next generation here as well as in India. Six months of uninterrupted efforts, including field visits by various members, resulted in the creation of a project for 610 young women at Sabarmati Ashram. The project focuses on education, and includes self defense training, banking skills, and character and leadership building, all with today's world in mind. The project launched on August 15, India's Independence Day, with a wish to bring marked improvement to the people of India from the economic and environmental challenges.

In September, we staged an exciting "Cooking for a Cause" competition for aspiring chefs, an idea developed by a young teenage philanthropist. The sold-out event generated overwhelming enthusiasm for our Women Empowerment Signature Program and generated about \$15,000. It also brought in new, prospective partners for this movement.

From its past results, we expanded the Educate 2 Success program to cover more areas for grants and to enable us to reach out to more deserving children. Our Educate 2 Graduate program continues to flourish and Healthcare 2 Unreached made headway into its new unveiling. You can learn more about each program's status and progress in their individual reports. While these projects continue to thrive, our Sanitation & Hygiene projects are now halted due to new developments in India.

Our current base of patrons remains steady, however, new challenges make it essential to look for expanded efforts to fill in the gap. Our e-based marketing and promotion has started producing results and is growing.

As we continue to look for new ideas — from resource generation to volunteerism to ensure we continue our very best in humility — we wish the very best to all of you, our patrons, volunteers, partners and beneficiaries.

OUR UNSUNG HERO & FOUNDER PRESIDENT ARUN BHANSALI (1941-2018)



Arun Bhansali, a philanthropist, an entrepreneur, and a visionary co-founder of Share & Care Foundation for India passed away on Tuesday, August 21, 2018 in New Jersey.

He is survived by his wife Sudha, sons Manan and Maulik, grandchildren Kaia and Aran, and sister-in-law Tejal. Until the night before his surgery, he remained engaged in pursuing charitable endeavors and communicating to project

team members to chart a course of actions to help the challenged.

Arunbhai was born in Kolkatta in 1941 to parents Kirtilal Bhansali and Prabhavati. He moved to Mumbai at a young age after his parents' death and completed his schooling and undergraduate studies. He felt deep down in his heart that he was blessed by the Almighty, who held his hand in dark days, kindled hope within him, and guided him to look forward with courage. He never forgot how happily 17 members of his family lived in two rooms. While growing up during many

sities, circumstance, missteps, systems or pre-judged ideas. He strongly felt that principles, values and ideas that he was exposed to at a young age provided him the ability and skills to develop into a person that he eventually became.

Arunbhai migrated to USA in 1966. As one of the first Indian diamond merchants to establish himself in New York, he succeeded in breaking into a closed network and built awareness and trust in Indian manufacturing. He became a founding member of the Indian Diamond & Colorstone Association and over the next 50 years, built a successful business and helped establish other Indians arriving in NY, and promote the diamond industry.

His love, affection, and commitment to India always remained. With a deep awareness of someone holding his hand to help him while growing up in challenging times, Arunbhai always carried a burning desire to help others when it was his turn. With another five likeminded close couples, who shared the same values to help others and give back to the country they came from, together they founded **Share & Care Foundation for India in 1982.**

In 1983 the undertaking of shipping used clothes was a great success. The members and their kids collected and sent a humble first shipment of two thousand pounds. In June '85 during their third drive 35 thousand pounds of clothes were received and shipped.

In an interview to the media in 2014, Arunbhai had said, "When we started Share & Care Foundation (SCF) in 1982, the ecosystem was much friendlier and community was in need of such platform. If I look back, I think the key reflection point was *'what we do for our motherland'*- when all of us were successful in our careers, reasonably well established and all our needs

were well satisfied. Most of us were very conscious that somebody's charity was instrumental in our success, so we got an excellent education almost at no cost. In those days, it was almost unheard of that many of us could travel to USA for further studies or work as family income could not support such venture. So we thought it is the time for us to 'Give back to our motherland' who gave us solid grounding and education."

During the journey of over the past 35 years, Arunbhai served in various capacities - as a President, Chairperson & Trustee of the Foundation which has helped over two million people with over \$75 million funding support in the areas of Education, Healthcare, Women Empowerment and post natural disaster rebuilding and rehabilitation.

Arunbhai, a diamond in rough who had a challenging childhood, became a shining star diamond with self-polished facets of: compassion, selfless service, and seva, liberating families from the cycle of poverty and bringing a social change in rural India. His guidance and leadership was a key element in the foundation's success in meeting goals.

In the last few years he focused on mentoring the next generation to take leadership positions in philanthropy and in early 2018 he started a US chapter of Mumbai based 'The Breakfast Revolution' that provides power packed meals to fight and uproot malnutrition in school age children.

He was always guided by his deeply held philosophy '*that you are important, but person next to you is more important*'.

Arunbhai, also joined and served as Secretary of Bhartiya Vidya Bhavan, New York in its inception. As a member of the Gujarati Literary Academy of North America he also had a passion for creative writing both in English and Gujarati. He has published a book, "*Seeing through the Lens of Good*", the history and his observations about the journey of Share & Care Foundation. Earlier this year, he had started work on his next book "*Autumn Leaves*" about being in the autumn of his life. Arun's wide range of lifetime achievements will inspire and motivate the next generation to carry forward the torch of being of service to others.

Looking back at his life, Arunbhai recently noted in his personal diary:

"Even a coin attains its full value when spent, so life attains its ultimate value when one knows how to forfeit it with grace when the time comes... I also learned, I am gradually becoming old and will pass away, that is an inevitable reality. So, I feel time should not be wasted, nor live with someone else's dreams. I believe not to be trapped by others preaching or thinking. Do not let the noise of other people's opinion drown you out but listen to your own inner voice. I have learned that I want to lead a meaningful life in face of all worldly success or sorrow. It gave me courage to do the right things and not to ride on two horses at a time. My insight dares me to choose one and I choose the right one."

He continues, "*I have not subscribed to the belief that nothing should be said about the dead. If people were evil in their lifetimes, death does not convert them into saints. Such falsehoods may be condoned when inscribed on tombstones but not in obituaries, which should be without bias and truthful. I have written few obituaries and condolences for the people I admired and loved. I did my best to be even handed as much as I could about them and I expect the same for myself"*

He concludes by quoting Ghalib, who put it beautifully:

“Age travels at a galloping pace, who knows where it will stop?”

“We do not have the reins in our hands, we do not have our feet in the stirrups.”

We at Share & Care celebrate Arunbhai's incredible life.

We honor him by recognizing and following the legacy he has left behind to provide selfless service to all those in need. As a founding member, he carried a deep-rooted desire and vision to help all those in challenged segment of the Indian society and to bring them out of the vicious cycle of poverty to become self-sufficient and contributing citizens. This vision has guided Share & Care to sharp-

en its focus to develop and implement programs to bring this social change over three and a half decades in the areas of Education, Healthcare, Welfare, Women Empowerment, Sanitation and Hygiene.

Arunbhai, we treasure your values and will strive to continue the journey you started. Although you are physically not with us anymore, your spirit will always guide each one of us and strengthen our commitment of being of service to others. The Share & Care family loves you and admires your leadership and mentoring and we will miss you dearly.

The larger Share & Care *parivaar* wishes to convey our heartfelt condolences to the Bhansali *parivaar*. We grieve with you and reach out to comfort you and comfort each other.

We pray to the Almighty to rest the departed soul of this remarkable man in eternal peace.

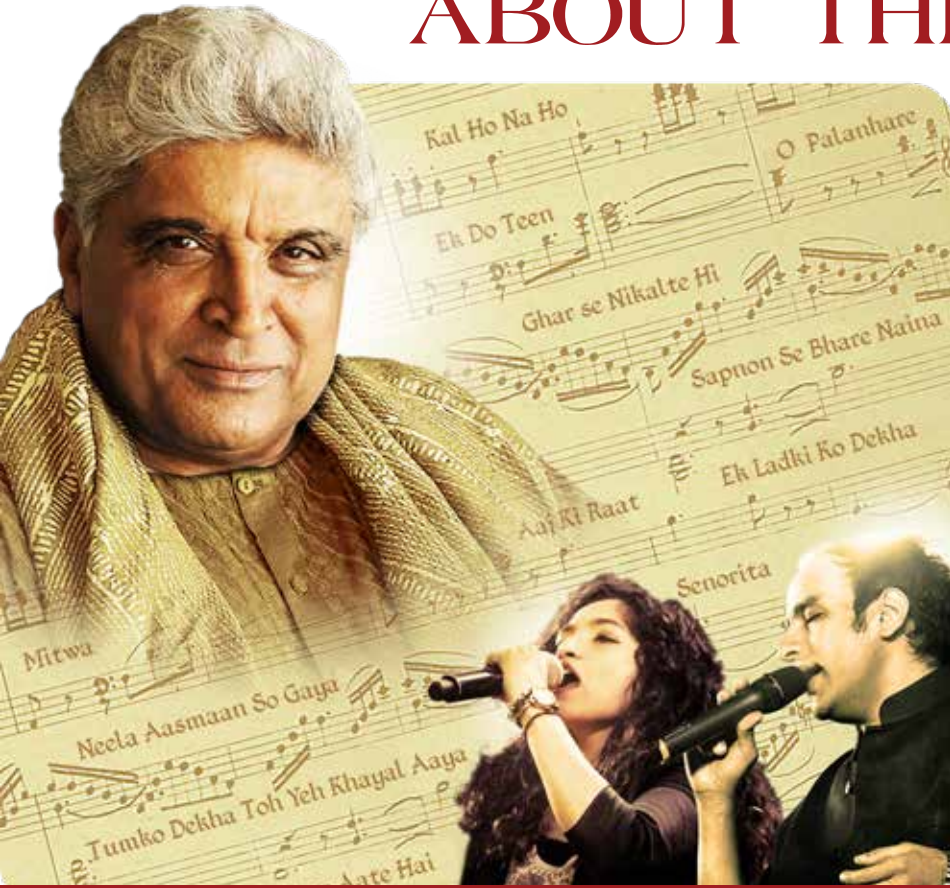

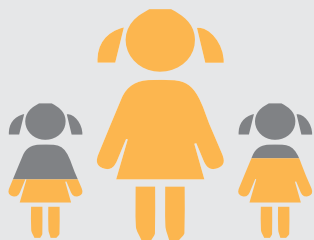
OUR MISSION

The Long Road Ahead

While we're happy to see positive results, we're also aware of the challenges women continue to face. For example, many women still experience some form of violence in their lifetimes. Risk factors for violence include lower levels of education, low levels of women's access to paid employment, ideologies of male entitlement, and weak legal consequences for violent behavior.

It's also an unfortunate reality that women make up more than two thirds of the world's

illiterate people; and in most countries, women are more likely to have seasonal, part-time, or low-wage jobs (and they often receive lower wages than men for performing the same work). A large gender gap remains in women's access to decision-making and leadership. We truly believe that gender inequality and lack of gender equity are the basis of most women's issues.

Our mission is far from achieved; instead, it is time to call for increased efforts to gain substantial results. We must continue to focus on women's education, gender equality training, personal safety education, livelihood skills training, character building, and leadership enhancement. We must continue to work with a variety of dedicated NGOs in India to support and modify their programs to include these key initiatives in their projects.

Success Stories

Basanti Devi

Basanti Devi is a woman farmer who has become an inspiration to poor women in tribal villages. She is a member of a self-help group and the only person in her family who earns a wage. She is always enthusiastic to learn and implement her knowledge.



“Two years back, before I was a member of a self-help group, I did agriculture only to grow food for our family. I never thought of it as a cash crop. After getting the training, I started to think about how to end our poverty and I started to believe that I could change my life. I decided to put into practice what I had learned. I started tomato cultivation for the first time as a cash crop, and I sold those tomatoes in the market and got my first earnings. This increased my self-confidence and inspired me to do it on a larger scale. Now I also think about cultivating other vegetables and investing my energy in livestock to increase my source of income. As my long-term plan, I see agriculture as a business to attain better life. I will be happy to see such transformation in each and every woman in my village.”

Sonu Kumari

Six months ago, a 19-year-old woman named Sonu Kumari joined a peer-led education group focused on gender justice. Before she joined the program, her parents worried about her safety. She was extremely shy and lacked the courage to advocate for herself. During the program, Sonu learned about women's rights. She became more assertive, and her shyness disappeared. After six months of training, she started raising questions about society and relationships, and felt empowered by the changes she saw in herself.

Then one day on her way home, she encountered an aggressive man. He spoke to her in obscene language and made physical gestures. She was able to use defensive moves and eventually caused him to run away.

Next, Sonu heard about a case of domestic violence in her village. She approached the woman, who confessed that her husband was an alcoholic and that she faced domestic violence regularly. The woman's family members were aware of the situation but, feeling hopeless, had accepted it. Sonu motivated the woman to start

attending the education group and encouraged her to discuss this with peer group members. Sonu and other members helped the woman discuss the issue with the husband as well as with the other family members. Since then, the woman has not faced domestic violence — and she has become an active participant in decision-making in the family.

These changes are seen as a miracle by the villagers and have been a motivating factor to other women in Sonu's community.

Millions of children in rural India drop of school early. This program provides such students with the support to re-enroll and complete their education.

I'm also a huge supporter of Share and Care's efforts to empower women. Over the years, many new programs have been developed. These include vocational training; financial management skills; self-defense lessons; confidence training - to help undo the traditional mindset of inferiority their communities have instilled in them; and gender equality education, for both boys and girls from a young age to change the way women are viewed in society.

Bringing Healthcare to the Deserts of India

The Share & Care Foundation continues to promote self-sustainable development of education and health infrastructures in northwestern Rajasthan's rural Khichan-Phalodi area and three villages (Jelu, Digadi, and Bhalasaring) in Osian Block, Jodhpur district of Rajasthan. Large parts of Jodhpur fall within the Thar Desert, a large, arid region vulnerable to chronic droughts and damaging winds. The brutal conditions are reflected in the high rates of disease, malnutrition, mortality, and morbidity rates among its inhabitants. Poor health hampers educational opportunities for all, and female illiteracy in particular is an ongoing challenge. In short, it is a very difficult area with little socio-economic development.

Working with a local NGO, Share & Care is delivering much-needed healthcare to villagers who require a combination of education, public sanitation, and regular access to healthcare providers and facilities. Villagers are taught advanced techniques of water conservation, desert horticulture, and production of healthy food crops in adverse conditions. We've been in Kerla village since 2010 and started the same program in Suwap village (in the same district) in 2015. Our work at Jelu, Digadi, and Bhalasaring villages, known as the Improving Child and Mother Survival project, is a bit more involved due to the additional water management and desert

horticulture training needed. The project's objective is to reduce infant and maternal mortality in three villages — affecting about 600 women, 1,200 children, and 400 adolescents — through education, nutritional enhancement, and better integration with government healthcare. We are currently in the second year of the three-year project.

Our Impact in Jelu, Digadi, and Bhalasaring

Over the past year, village health workers have started playing a more active role in overall community development. As a result, women feel more informed, confident, and involved in their own health. Adolescents are becoming more aware of various diseases, including sexually transmitted diseases such as AIDS; the importance of hygiene; and the role a balanced diet plays in their lives.

Under the project, 50 horticultural units have been established this year, which will start yielding fruit in two to two-and-a-half years. Most of the units are in good shape and nearly 95% of the plants have survived.

In the first year of the project, 12 antenatal camps have been organized, benefiting over 370 women. The nutrition sessions have helped children understand the importance of receiving vital nutrients through a balanced diet. The annual cost of the nutrition sessions is still less than \$14 per person.

Desert Oasis

Bidami Devi, 56, is a resident of Digadi village, Rajasthan. Her family of 13 live in severe poverty, with no direct access to vegetables and fruits for a balanced diet. Through Share & Care's work, her family has been provided a nutrition garden (known as an arid horticulture unit) that has 20 plants, including both vegetables and fruits, that can survive and grow well in arid conditions. It contributes to nutrition security and income generation.

The family is already getting vegetables from the units and the yield of fruits will be possible in the next couple of years. All of this enriches their diet significantly, thus improving their overall nutritional and health status.

Our Impact in Kerla and Suwap Villages

Share & Care became involved in Kerla in 2010, and in Suwap in 2015, to form a much-needed healthcare program. By 2016, an abandoned health center was completely renovated, including a waiting area, a small laboratory, a birthing facility, a well-equipped residential facility for nursing staff, underground water storage, and indoor in-patient care.

As of Summer 2018

- **4,300 women, men, and children** were seen at the Kerla and Suwap health centers between January and June 2018.
- **36 infants (< 1 yr.) and 15 children (1–5 yrs.)** received vaccinations.
- **98 pregnant women** received antenatal care and immunizations.
- **38 women** visited for the first time, and 13 for the second time, and were immunized.
- **1–4 per women per week** — down from around 22–32 per week in 2012 — sought treatment for pelvic inflammation, which is very common among women in the area.



Because of timely treatment:

- Human whipworm no longer results in malnutrition.
- Skin diseases, such as scabies and ringworm, no longer spread throughout the population.
- Common ailments such as malnutrition, anemia, and hypocalcaemia (low calcium); and chronic diseases such as asthma, diabetes, and COPD no longer lead to additional health issues.
- **The yearly cost per patient is less than \$10.**

In Their Own Words

We, all resident of village Kerla, are very thankful to Share & Care who have constructed the Kerla health sub-center in an organized way and provided required medicines. Prior to this renovated health center, during deliveries both mother and infant used to die due to lack of facilities [and access to] blood tests. Iron and calcium tablets were not available and vaccination facilities for children were lacking. [Over the] last five years, during antenatal care, hemoglobin is measured so a patient knows whether they require blood or if there is deficiency.

Accordingly, they take their treatment. Also, villagers didn't know where to seek help, [now] here at the health sub-center, doctors advise us and treat us accordingly. We pray to God that in the future, the health sub-center continues to run in [this] nice way.

I would like to say that since the Kerla health sub-center started five years back, I visit this center every week to check my blood pressure, and accordingly, I take [my medication]. In the past, when there was no facility around, we use to take pills just by speculation, without knowing the status of our [blood pressure]. Now we take [our] pills according to our requirements and live [a] comfortable life. We are very thankful to Share & Care for having built this hospital and provide services.

We at Share & Care Foundation express our sincere thanks to our partner NGOs. Together with HBS Trust we are bringing sustainable development of education and health infrastructure to rural Rajasthan, and with GRAVIS on our Improving Child and Mother Survival project. ●

NEW MONITORING & EVALUATION GUIDELINES

We know nothing speaks louder than data-centric results.

Starting in 2016, the E2G Committee has a new monitoring and evaluation protocol which tracks each individual student's personal and academic data to a high degree. This protocol was designed with E2G's rapid expansion in mind, and helps to efficiently track each student's progress and successes while also highlighting deficiencies that need to be addressed.

Transforming the Lives of Brilliant but Financially Needy Students and Their Families

E2G provides interest-free loan-scholarships for their higher education.

We must support education in every way we can. We must accept that good education is vital in breaking the cycle of poverty, improving lives, sustaining a healthy society, and enabling the country's economic growth. Education creates opportunity and drives progress. Education brings huge transformation to the life of children. It enables them to achieve their full potential. For bright students who hope to earn a college degree, but don't have the necessary financial resources, Share & Care Foundation's Educate 2 Graduate Signature Program provides a wonderfully innovative solution.



The program provides a zero interest loan-scholarship to poor students so they can fulfil their dreams of getting a professional degree in science, engineering, IT, medicine, or commerce that will help them get a good job after graduation. We started the program in 2007 and it has achieved great success over the last 11 years by providing loans to more than 1,400 students. Of these, 687 (50%) students have already graduated and 625 (91%) of the graduates are either gainfully employed in professional work or are studying further for even brighter futures.

How E2G Brings About Real Change

The benefits of E2G are self-evident: It makes higher education a reality to thousands of deserving students and places them directly on a path to a secure future — for the students and their entire family. This is truly transformational for children raised in poverty. The program's positive economic impact is astounding — **we are seeing E2G graduates earning up to 30 times more than that of their parents.**

The E2G program is effectively implemented by well-established NGO partners working directly with various communities in India. When we launched the program more than 10 years ago, we had one NGO partner in Bharuch, Gujarat, and just six students. Since then it has expanded greatly. We added another NGO partner in Rajkot, Gujarat, in 2009 and then we added one more NGO partner in Chennai, Tamil Nadu, in 2016. **To date, Share & Care has provided loan-scholarships to 1,409 students and contributed \$1.86 million to the program.**

Our experience over the past decade confirms that E2G has immense potential for growth. An investment in E2G is truly an investment with unlimited returns.

We at Share & Care are humbled and proud of you, our supporters, who have made the dreams of thousands of bright young scholars turn into reality, and transformed their lives and that of future generations.

THE CASE FOR ORGAN DONATION

There is a worldwide crisis in organ donation, in which the need for healthy organs vastly exceeds the number of available donors. In the U.S. alone, 114,000 people are suffering from some type of organ failure and are on a waiting list for a transplant. About 83% of these are kidney failure cases, the rest being liver, heart, lung, and other organs — yet only about 35,000 transplants occur each year due to the lack of willing donors. Consequently, many patients remain on transplant lists for years at a time, living with severe pain and a continuous need for life-sustaining therapies such as dialysis. The median U.S. wait time for a kidney transplant is 3.6 years, but it can vary greatly; some patients wait up to 10 years. And every day in the U.S., about 20 people die waiting for an organ transplant.

Organ donation happens in two forms: deceased organ donation and living organ donation. Deceased donation is when a person pledges their organs to be transplanted to another person in the event of their death. This is a simple way to potentially make a huge difference in the lives of others. If you were to die unexpectedly, your organs could go on to save the lives of up to eight people. What greater meaning or purpose could be found in your death than to give life to others? Unfortunately, only 45 percent of U.S. adults are registered as deceased organ donors. The reasons for this vary, but include a simple lack of awareness, or missed opportunities during DMV registration. If this is the case, I urge you to go register right now online at www.organdonor.gov/register.html.

A less often considered (but perhaps more powerful) form of donation is living organ donation. This is when an organ is transplanted from a willing and healthy donor to someone in need. It is a practical and safe way to provide the gift of life to another person.

I am a living donor myself. I donated my left kidney to a stranger in April 2018. It has been one of the most important and meaningful experiences of my life.

We are each born with two kidneys, yet most of us can live perfectly healthy and normal lives with just one. Donating a living kidney has many benefits over donating a deceased kidney. Living donations can be planned well in advance, allowing for optimal matching between the donor and recipient. Living donations have a much better long-term survival rate than deceased donations — 20 years versus 10 years. Living donors are thoroughly screened to make sure they are healthy and have a very low risk of long-term health problems after donation. I returned to work six weeks after my surgery, and since then my life has been perfectly healthy. I've enjoyed biking, swimming, and playing with my kids, and am living a full and active life. There is no impact on my life expectancy and no restrictions on what activities I can participate in.

Living donors often donate to a specific loved one, but some donors (such as myself) donate with no specific person in mind. These are also called "non-directed" or "altruistic" donations. Altruistic donations are especially important. Through a process called "kidney paired donation," an altruistic donation can start a chain reaction that can provide transplants to dozens of patients. I have the great satisfaction of knowing that my donation may provide life-changing benefits to not just one person, but many.

Like many of us, I have been very blessed in my life. I have good health, a loving family, and an education, and have never wanted for food or shelter. I believe the world is a better place when we share our good fortune with those who are less fortunate. There are many ways we can make a positive difference in this world. E2S: Good Things Flourish With a Vision

Good things do indeed flourish with a vision. Knowing that tens of thousands of children drop out before completing their secondary school education in India each year, the Share & Care Foundation is engaged in empowering rural India as a vehicle for change and do its share to eliminate this woe. We are working closely with established NGOs to reach out to the most vulnerable in rural Indian society — specifically, women and children. The objective of E2S is to assist these students in completing their secondary school education and then seek jobs, go for vocational training, or to pursue higher education.

Our goal is to empower the defenseless with supportive programs that are sustainable over time. With the help of the “3E approach,” long-term impact is based on three action items:

1. **Educate:** Reinstate/sustain in schools, provide supplementary education, extra curricular activities.
3. **Empower:** Meditation and personality development through imparting life skills.
3. **Equip:** Vocational guidance, career planning, computer training, and English language development.

Some of the most at-risk in the target area are dropouts. Over 40% of Indian students drop out before reaching 8th grade, and the numbers in rural areas are even higher.

Share & Care supports work with children from rural, tribal, and underserved areas, and equips them with the skills to lead productive lives. With a strong focus on girl's education,

the program creates opportunities in higher education, vocational training, and job placements for some of the most disadvantaged students who would otherwise have dropped out of schools only to end up as a burden to society.

PAYING IT FORWARD AND INFLUENCING SOCIETY AT LARGE

Warren Buffett talks about the power of compounding interest and how with simple discipline in investing you can retire a millionaire. If you take this concept of compounding and apply it to things like positive energy, charity, and helping others, the impact to the world can be unbelievably powerful.

I've noticed that everyone has an intrinsic desire to help others, but many of us just don't have the time. That's where Share & Care Foundation stepped in for me. This year, I had an incredible opportunity to visit and interview many beneficiaries from Share & Care's Signature Programs.

One of my field trips was to Satyagraha Ashram in Ahmedabad, Gujarat. Their vision is: "A literate woman has the capacity to transform a family, while a value-oriented female teacher has the capacity to transform thousands of families over a lifetime."

Satyagraha Ashram (later renamed Sabarmati Harijan Ashram) was established in 1917 by Gandhiji. Yes, the Gandhiji — Mahatma Gandhi — whose principles and revolutionary ideals of non-violence have inspired generations of us.

Satyagraha Ashram currently hosts different institutions that promote Gandhiji's constructive works such as sanitation, women empowerment, literacy, and the eradication of oppression relating to "untouchability." They also address other social issues such as early marriages, poor sanitation and health, and high crime rates.

They host female students from the most marginalized and lowest socioeconomic communities and "low-caste families," or the so-called "untouchables." When meeting these girls, I sensed a feeling of overwhelming gratitude — a belief that they were the chosen ones, who got out of desolate circumstances.



Satyagraha Ashram has three schools: a primary school, a high school, and a teachers' training college. Some of the students travel from remote villages and stay in the hostel. For example, more than 600 students come from sweepers, scavengers, and other marginalized backgrounds to study in primary school at the Ashram. The main purpose of the hostel is to provide safety and security to the girls while teaching them life skills. Students also receive free nutritious meals, school uniforms, notebooks, and other necessities in addition to tuition.

Share & Care's Vision to Support the Ashram:

Vision: To cultivate leadership in adolescent girls from backward communities by nurturing their social-emotional, physical, and cognitive needs. Over time, they

will become ladders to support their communities.

Mission: Through focus on 1) education, 2) health, nutrition, sports, and self-defense, and 3) gender equity, character-building, and life skills, we will help to empower the leader in each girl.

This project will be dedicated to girls between 14 and 21 years of age. These young girls are students of our Ashram Vinay Mandir High School (Class 9th to 12th) and Stree Adhyapan Mandir Primary Teachers Training College in the Residential Sabarmati Gandhi Ashram Learning Campus.

The social workers and teaching staff at Satyagrah are dedicated, and many have remained to volunteer after their working hours. During my visit I also met interns and volunteers from different walks of life, including college interns, housewives volunteering their time, and professionals offering their expertise. This is a true example of community.

The Ashram faces a need for funding to pay their teachers, maintain infrastructure, and provide school supplies. They've proven that they can execute their

goals, empower the next generation, and help to eradicate social evils.

Satyagraha is doing its part.

It's our turn now.

SHARE & CARE KIDS: CREATING A COMMUNITY OF CHILDREN WHO CARE

My vision for Share & Care Kids is to help thousands of children across the globe get the education we take for granted here in America. This can start with anyone. Anyone can make a donation, and anyone can help. My goal at the end of four years is to help at least 1,000 kids have an education.

I am transitioning to high school, and I recently visited multiple charities in India. There, I learned that one-third of Indian students drop out of school before 8th grade. I want these kids to be able to continue their education throughout high school (and beyond). I plan to invite high school students to sponsor one child across the world every year, and get to know the teens they are sponsoring. This is an opportunity to build a community of children leaders — leaders who will make an impact and help our world become more educated.

Here are just a few snapshots of what I learned and experienced during my trip.

I visited multiple charities and met dozens of children my age. Many of them had moving stories. One girl had no father, and her mother had cancer and was doing treatments. So the girl, who was in 9th grade, had to work and feed herself while also going to school. Her mom is getting better, but the girl still has to do everything for her

family. She is working every day to survive. We cannot even imagine this. That day was humbling for me.

Another day, I visited the slums outside of Worli, a part of Mumbai. In the slums, there was a private tutoring class for children in the area. This class is organized by the NGO Light of Life Trust (part of Share & Care's E2S Signature Program). The kids who enter this program have

families who only make around 5,000 rupees (about 73 dollars) a month. All the kids there have major challenges in their lives.

I interviewed four kids about their lives and about how the class helps them. They all said that it helps a lot, and they all have very nice goals in life. Because they live in the slums, their homes are around 250 sq. feet each, and usually include six to seven people. There are only two hours of running water each day, and the children do not have beds to sleep on.

These kids need help, and we can help them. They all have one thing in common: the need to be educated. Education is a necessity in life for people all around the world, and we are very lucky to have access to it. So let's improve the world, and make all of our futures brighter, by helping kids just like us get the education they deserve!

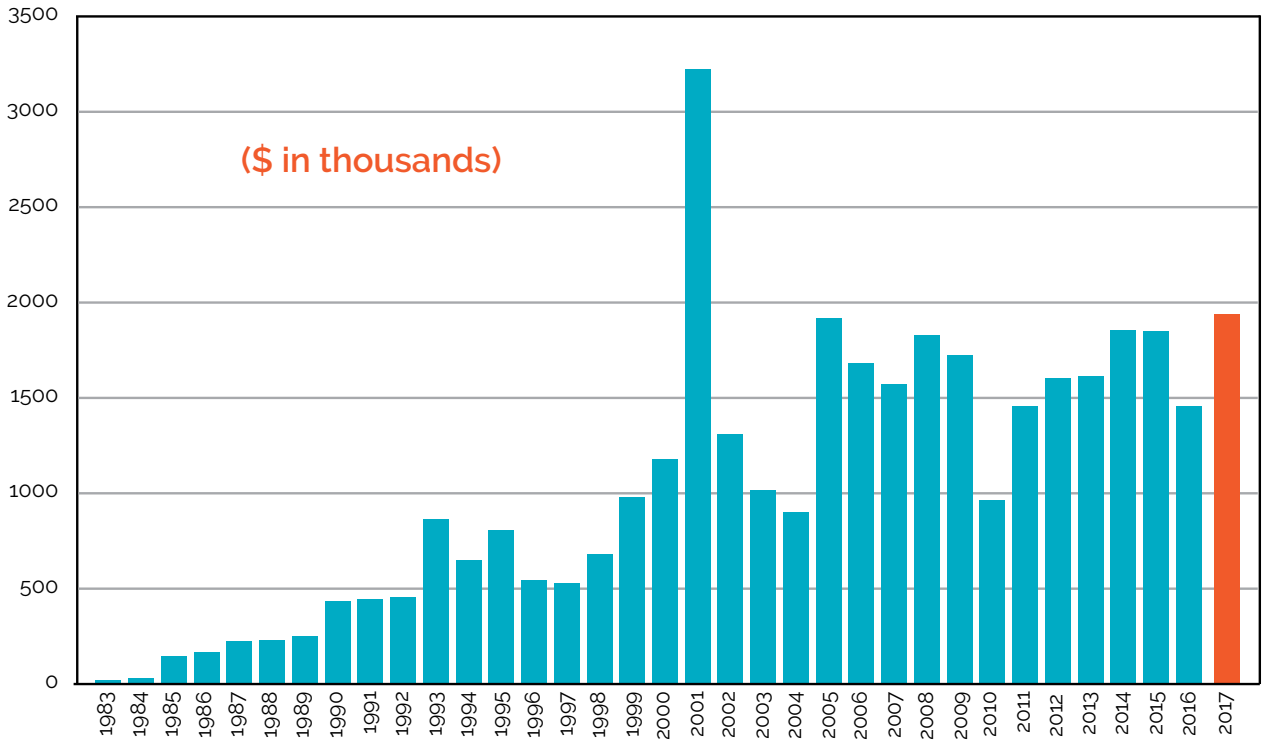

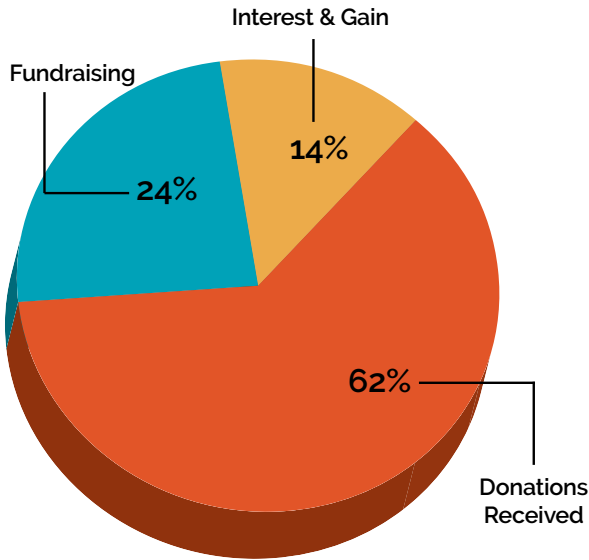

Total Cash Donations



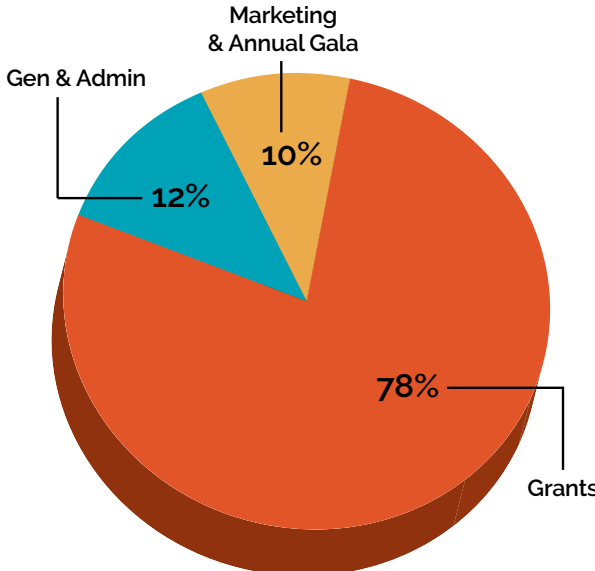
2017 Revenue & Support

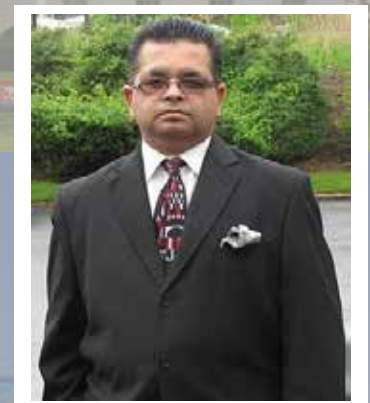



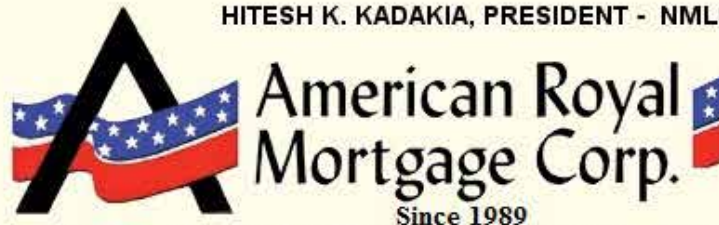
