# DEAR PATRONS AND FRIENDS...



August 10, 2019

I was sitting on the bank of the Hudson River in downtown Manhattan last week, overlooking the beautiful skyline of Jersey City, New Jersey. The view from the same site a decade ago was much different. What a dramatic and positive change!

A question came to my mind: How did people cross this river a century ago? Swimming or using a small sailboat would be the answer. Just as I was contemplating the speed of progress, a two-seat motorized boat passed by, followed by a high-speed super craft on the river and passenger jet in the sky. The proof of progress over the years was right in front of me. While this was not an extraordinary experience, it made me realize that progress is always ongoing, and it is relative to what you compare it with. Better things are always yet to come.

Our humanity work is no different. When we look at our cumulative work of over \$75 million and think of the significant differences we've made, we realize that we have accomplished great things. However, when looking at the difference between what the advanced world has and what marginalized people are missing, we quickly understand that our work is far from over. We will be in this battle (to reduce the gap in accessibility of resources to a respectable level, and to bring dignity for our fellow human beings) for a long time.

Naturally, questions arise about how our foundation is reacting to this evolving world.

## 1. Project Analysis:

A decade ago, we adopted Educate 2 Graduate as a Signature Program, followed by Healthcare 2 Unreached, Women Empowerment, Educate 2 Success, and Sanitation.

One may not see the full scope of change at any given moment in time. However, by evaluating the results of our programs from initiation to present day, our impact is swiftly apparent. Unfortunately, the gap between the top and bottom segments of society has increased, and other factors affecting the programs are changing. Our programs need to

be redesigned to address these issues. We are preparing ourselves to complete this enormous work in a short time.

## 2. Resource Analysis:

**Volunteer Work:** Volunteerism is vital for us as it ensures a true passion for humanity, mitigates any financial burden on the foundation, and brings various expertise and credibility. Our current force is enthused and operating at full speed, but it is important to bring in younger volunteers, and I am very happy to inform that new faces are visible throughout our organization and in our activities.

**Other Resources:** Our major resource generation has been from goodwill, word of mouth, and reputation. Even though this will continue, we see a great need for new methods to attract prospective patrons. I am very proud to state that we are adapting quickly and seeing good results. A few examples of this success include the 5K Walk/Run, the Young Professional Committee (YPC) Gala, and the Cooking for a Cause fundraiser, along with up-to-date communication methods including social media.

## 3. Partnership Analysis:

Our work takes us from remote parts of India to a range of other severely affected areas around the world. Often, we have to reach beneficiaries quickly and have no time for cumbersome logistical analysis. This requires us to have contacts with like-minded people who can carry out our projects quickly, efficiently, and without adding unusual cost. In India, we depend on proven Non-Government Organizations as well as individuals with great repute, but the next generation will require different types of networking. The involvement of Share & Care Kids4Kids and the YPC group in our core activities are examples of steps we are taking to prepare the next generation for success.

## Year 2020:

We are targeting 2020 as a major landmark which will be extremely significant for us in many ways. Our most important goal is to help out at least 20,200 people in 2020. I am confident that the steps we are taking will equip us to face challenges ahead and meet this informal goal.

This will be improbable unless we all are together.

Joining Kids4Kids was a decision I made without hesitation. Share & Care was founded by a group of friends, my

grandparents among them. As a young child, when I heard that they had created such a successful organization, I was impressed and inspired at the same time. It was in this moment that I also wanted to make a difference. So, joining Kids4Kids is the perfect opportunity to make an impact on those who are less fortunate than I am.

The story of Share & Care's first major activity has been told to me countless times. Share & Care collected and donated around 2,000 pounds of used clothing to send to India. Eventually, that amount grew to 20,000 pounds of used clothing annually — enough to fill a 40-foot-long shipping container, which was brought into the driveway of my grandparents' home! My mother, being their daughter, helped in every way that she could, from loading used clothing into the tractor trailer to proofreading letters and documents. These three people have taught me the value of giving and motivated me to be involved.

With one selfless act of collecting used clothing, Share & Care began their mission of improving life in rural India. Over the years, Share & Care broadened its horizons and began providing support for education, healthcare, women's empowerment, and much more. As Nelson Mandela so wisely stated, "Education is the most powerful weapon which you can use to change the world." I am proud to work with Share & Care Kids4Kids to help increase knowledge of the underprivileged in India because I know that by being educated, one's life can be transformed in ways that are unimaginable. ●





- On average, the family income of an E2G graduate was about \$750 annually. Now the average income of an employed graduate is about \$5,000 annually.
- We work with 3 NGO partners in India to implement the E2G program.
- We track each individual student's metrics to monitor progress.

## Educate to Graduate: Cultivating Potential and Realizing Dreams for Deserving Scholars

Nelson Mandela once said, "Education is the most powerful weapon which you can use to change the world." When we help brilliant but economically challenged Indian youngsters obtain a college education and earn professional degrees, they in time can transform their world and start contributing to the process of nation building.

Uplifting these youths can also help break the cycle of generational poverty for their families — thus erasing inequality. In 2007, Share & Care took the wheel and initiated the drive toward equality with the Educate to Graduate (E2G) program. The program has provided zero-interest loan-scholarships to high performing and ambitious students from poor families. The program has been a singular success.

Over the span of a dozen years, E2G has helped 1,535 brilliant scholars realize their dream of a college education. About 700 students are currently studying for their college degrees,

and another 800 have already graduated and are gainfully employed or studying for their post-graduate degrees. When comparing incomes, we are seeing E2G graduates earning five to 20 times — and occasionally as much as 40 times — the income of their parents. Thus, acquiring higher education with the help of our E2G program improves lives and puts entire families on the path to a secure future.

The E2G program is successfully implemented by our three NGO partners located in the states of Gujarat and Tamil Nadu. To date, Share & Care has contributed \$2.1 million to the program.

The benefits of E2G are self-evident. Share & Care has become a catalyst for thousands of deserving students by nurturing their potential and securing a brighter future for them and their families, now and for generations to come.

### Breaking News: E2G Program Upgraded to Scholarship Program

In recent years, other avenues have opened up in Gujarat for students to obtain financial assistance for higher education. Since 2015, the state government has announced several scholarship and interest-free loan schemes for deserving students to ensure that no bright student is denied a college education. In view of these developments, Share & Care upgraded E2G for 2019 by changing the format from a loan program (interest-free loans paid back after securing a degree and a job) to a scholarship program (no repayment), and our plan is to provide scholarships to about 70 new students this year.

Under this program, the scholarship is designed to meet the shortfall in funds once the student has obtained primary assistance from any of the government schemes. The upgraded E2G program will allow us to select the brightest students from the poorest segments of society.

The mission of the E2G program is to financially help bright students from very low-income families obtain a college degree for a professional career. The objective is to bring out their full potential and alleviate generational poverty for their families. It is a truly transformational program.

### Heartwarming, Inspirational Stories From Our E2G Scholars



#### Utpak Pankhania: Once a Marginalized Student, Now an Empowered Citizen and Mentor

Utpak's father, a newspaper vendor in Ahmedabad, Gujarat, worked to provide his family of four with the very basic necessities. However, his earnings of

less than \$1,500 per year were not enough to meet the expenses of college for Utpak and his younger brother. Utpak, a motivated learner, dreamed of getting a higher education and bringing his family out of poverty. His determination helped him earn high marks in Std. XII, which allowed him to appear for the IIT-JEE entrance examination.

Scoring well on this exam, he secured admission to the Indian Institute of Technology Kharagpur in West Bengal. At this time, we provided him with an interest-free loan for all four years of his studies under the E2G program. He graduated with a B.Tech degree, worked for two years — earning 10 times his family's income — and then secured admission for an MBA at the Indian Institute of Management Ahmedabad. He earned his masters in June 2019 and was immediately hired by a multinational company, where his yearly compensation package is over 40 times his family's income!

Recently, Utpak told us that when the mailman delivered the E2G acceptance letter, his mother said, "Bharuch vala Saheb ne toh bhagvane mokalaya chhe" (God has sent the Sir from HEST, Bharuch, to help us).

"Through the E2G program I was able to complete my education," says Utpak, "and through regular scholar meetings, it has molded me into a humbler human being who is sensitive to marginalized sections of society. In today's world, only magic can make a stranger help the needy like us."



**Kaushik Mahida: Once a Student From the Backward Class, Now an Empowered Medical Doctor**

Kaushik's father, a Harijan weaver living in Bagsara village of Amreli district in Gujarat earning less than \$1,800 per year, could not even provide for Kaushik's high school education. However, one of his teachers recognized his talents and provided financial support so Kaushik could graduate from high school.

To realize his dream of becoming a doctor, Kaushik graduated with high marks and se-

cured admission to medical school. For financial help, his teacher directed him to the Share & Care E2G program. He qualified and received support that carried him through college to become a medical doctor. He graduated in 2016 and is now working at a village health center near Amreli and drawing a handsome salary. He recently commented that without his teacher providing financial support during high school and the E2G program for his college education, he would not have been able to fulfill his dream of becoming a doctor.



**M. Saranya: Once a Marginalized Student From the Poorest of the Poor, Now Pursuing Career as Research Pharmacist**

Sarnaya's father, a daily laborer with a chronic heart condition, and her mother, a homemaker, live in a rented thatched hut in Nallamur village of Kanchipuram district in Tamil Nadu. They



struggled to provide the very basic necessities for their family of five.

Saranya dreamed of going to college. When she graduated with distinction from high school, her ambitions and good marks secured college admission for a pharmacy program in Chennai. She heard about the E2G program, applied, and is currently in her second year. The transformation process has begun in her life. She is doing well in college and working hard to complete the B. Pharm program. She then wants to go for her postgraduate degree and eventually become a research pharmacist.

## Cultivating Bright Futures for India's Most Vulnerable Students

The future of any nation lies in the hands of its young people, and the potential of any child depends significantly on his or her access to education.

Sadly, India is facing an extreme dropout crisis, with more than 100 million children who do not attend school — almost always due to factors beyond their control. According to UDISE (2016-17) more than 70 percent of India's out-of-school children reside in rural areas, with 40 million between 12 and 16 years old. The dropout rate increases with age due to various reasons, such as: staying home to care for younger siblings, working to earn extra income for their families, or lacking access to secondary schools entirely.

Our Educate 2 Success (E2S) Signature Program is committed to addressing India's dropout and literacy crises by bringing comprehensive educational resources to India's most vulnerable and at-risk students. To accomplish this, we have partnered with grassroots NGOs like Light of Life Trust (LOLT) and other reputable organizations, such as Gujarat Vidyapith.

Through our partnership with LOLT, we provide impoverished and neglected children with the support they

need not only to stay in school, but also to cultivate a lifelong passion for learning and personal development. This initiative, called Project Anando, utilizes a localized selection process to support neglected children from very disadvantaged families, as well as children who are orphans or who come from tribal or single-parent households. Forty percent of our beneficiaries were raised in critical environments, referring to abusive or alcoholic conditions or needy households that include more than seven family members.

To position these students for success, we employ the "3E" approach, meaning: "Educate, Empower, and Equip for Employability." This comprehensive method provides educational materials and training as well as intensive counseling and ongoing home visits, parent and community awareness training sessions, peer group meetings, and weekend workshops designed to build self-confidence.

Our aim is to nurture the holistic development of each young learner. As such, it is critical to include the children's families, teachers, peers, and community within the project, as these members of society are all major influencers within the beneficiaries' lives.



Lastly, because it is important to prepare students for life after school (and to support them in choosing career paths appropriate for their interests and capabilities), our beneficiaries also receive guidance in their desired post-Std. X pursuits — such as higher education or vocational training.

As of July 2018, E2S has served 669 beneficiaries through Project Anando, with 90 percent going on to pursue higher studies.



*To ensure sustainable change, family members and community influencers are urged to take an active part in our beneficiaries' education and development.*

Without intervention, these hundreds of students would almost certainly have faced lives of extreme hardship. Now, they are able to pursue their dreams and reach their full potential.

## Preparing Students for a Rapidly Advancing World

Share & Care has also joined forces with Gujarat Vidyapith for a project enabling school-age students to meet the challenges of rapidly advancing science and technology. We have chosen 25 schools in the Banaskantha districts of Gujarat for the implementation of a new methodology known as the "NBG System of Science Learning."

This program presents an overall look at the effects of science and technology in daily life, providing students with the familiarity and skills to cope with the changing world. Implementation of this program will lead to student empowerment in science learning, resulting in the upliftment and skill potential of students in the area.

## Bhagyashree's Hard-Earned Rise to Success

Bhagyashree Wayare Bhagyashree was a single-parent child whose mother worked as the sole earning member of her family. With only a modest job selling flowers and no support from relatives, her mother struggled to make ends meet. It was extremely hard for Bhagyashree to continue with her education. Thankfully, in 2006, she was enrolled in Project Anando. She passed her Std X and XII exams with good marks and took an active part in all extracurricular activities.

After completing Std XII, she did not want to take any common path. Instead, she chose a unique goal for herself — that of pursuing a professional career. At this time she coincidentally got an opportunity to attend a seminar at the Frankfinn Institute of Air Hostess Training, Mumbai. Highly motivated by the seminar, Bhagyashree decided to pursue the Diploma Course (Air Hostess Training) from the Frankfinn Institute. This was a turning point in her life.

With support from an education loan, she successfully completed the course. Immediately after, she obtained a job with Merchant (Five Star) Hotel in Navi Mumbai, and within six months she received yet another offer from the well-known Welspun Company. Not stopping there, she went on to earn a diploma in Logistics, Export, and Shipping. This additional qualification helped her earn a promotion and ultimately, a chance to work in Welspun's Export & Imports sector with a generous rewards package.

We could not be prouder of Bhagyashree and all our other beneficiaries who are working hard to build brighter futures for themselves, their families, and their communities. ●

## Share & Care Foundation Remembers and Honors Dr. Jyotsna Gandhi (1938–2019)



Dr. Jyotsna Gandhi, a longtime member of the Share & Care family, passed away peacefully at her home in White Plains, New York, on March 3, 2019.

Born 1938 in India, Jyotsna Gandhi was educated at Grant Medical College of the University of Bombay. After immigrating to the United States in 1964, she specialized in obstetrics & gynecology and maternal fetal medicine at various teaching hospitals in the New York area. She is also the author of research papers and edited books on maternal fetal medicine.

Jyotsna served as a chairperson of the Medical and Technology committee of the Share & Care Foundation from 1999 to 2002. During her tenure, Share & Care shipped \$10 million of medical equipment, supplies, and medicines to needy hospitals and institutions in India.

She is survived by her husband Anant Gandhi, her two children Samir and Swati, her daughter-in-law Anita Khushalani, four grandchildren, Jivan, Priya, Zora, and Nayna, her sister Rajni Vora, and her brother Ashok Gandhi.

We at Share & Care celebrate Jyotsna's rich and incredible life. We honor her by recognizing the legacy she left behind by dedicating ourselves to continue the endless journey of providing selfless service to the challenged segment of Indian society. We pray to the Almighty to rest her soul in eternal peace.



## Reaching the Unreached: H2U Continues Living Up to Its Name

Thanks to your support of the Healthcare to Unreached (H2U) Signature program, our growing impact is making a real difference for thousands of lives.

Over the last year, our work in tribal areas of Bharuch, Valsad, and Narmada districts in Gujarat, and in remote villages of drought-prone Thar Desert in Rajasthan continues to deliver more services to more villagers in need of basic medical and antenatal care, healthcare education, and nutritional guidance and resources. Here's a look at how our mission is impacting those previously denied their basic human right to healthcare. We are continually amazed at the myriad ways people can learn to help themselves, and are proud to have played a role in their successes.

### Improving Mother and Child Survival Through Horticulture

Because of persistent drought conditions and chronic water shortages, food crops are extremely challenging for Thar Desert communities. And while vitamins and minerals are essential for women and men of all ages, acute deficiencies for girls, teens, and women—including during pregnancy—are extremely common.

As part of the Improving Mother and Child Survival project, which has impacted 2,200 women and children over the last two years, communities

are being trained to care for what are called *arid horticulture units*. Each unit consists of 16 to 20 desert-friendly plants, such as plum, lemon, pomegranate, and guava. The plants are

watered using the home's waste water, and pitcher irrigation (an ancient, but efficient system using buried pitchers of water) provides ongoing moisture. Once harvested, the yield

is used for both nutrition and income. Surpluses are sold at market, and profits go back into creating additional units.

Arid horticulture units are making a significant difference for rural communities, particularly those challenged by the extreme arid conditions of Thar Desert, and we plan to assist Gravis in expanding this holistic approach into more villages in need.

### Harvesting Life-Giving Water

Water is a basic need for all humans, and getting the amount needed is especially difficult when the annual rainfall average (for Thar Desert) is roughly 4 to 29 inches (100 to 500 mm). Working with Gravis, rural desert villages are now making use of rainwater harvesting systems to benefit their communities.

Rain is collected using *taankas*, 10' x 10' underground cylinders that hold up to 25,000 liters (roughly 6,600 gallons), that not only capture runoff, they also have redundant filtering systems to ensure water purity. The abundance of flat village rooftops make perfect *taankas* sites. Another resource is community ponds, or *naadis*, that can be drawn on year-round.

### ImTeCHO Technology Brings Lifesaving Care to Tribal Gujarat

Beginning in 2018, Share & Care has been working with NGO SEWA Rural on an initiative called ImTecho, an acronym for Innovative Mobile Phone Technology for Community Health Operations.

The story behind ImTeCHO involves a custom healthcare app used by trained social health activists, known as *ashas*. Equipped with a cell phone and the healthcare app, *ashas* make scheduled home visits and submit health information through the app to offsite healthcare providers, who in turn instruct the *ashas* to administer medicines and perform other basic services as needed. Or in some cases, find a way to move a patient to the nearest healthcare center.

Access to healthcare for women and infants in tribal areas of Bharuch, Valsad, and Narmada districts of Gujarat has meant access to lifesaving birthing facilities and home-based newborn care. In addition to basic

health checkups and immunizations, *ashas* help new mothers initiate exclusive breastfeeding, which plays an important role in reducing child mortality and morbidity. In fact, infant and maternal morbidity rates in these regions have been reduced by 25%. With our involvement, the total villages and individuals that will benefit from ImTeCHO — that is, the number of people who will have access to healthcare for the very first time — will increase fivefold.

Approximately 10,000 pregnant women and 9,000 newborn infants, predominantly from tribal communities, benefit each year from ImTeCHO. Over time, the total villages and individuals that

will benefit from Share & Care's involvement will affect the lives of more than 110,000 people and 3,000 villages. These are impressive numbers, but the bottom line is we are improving lives for thousands of people challenged by the very basic human rights most of us take for granted. Thank you for helping make this all possible.



Empower women in its truest sense by bringing a change in the society in which there is an environment of optimal gender equality and equity, women feel safe and can gain livelihood skills with tools to enhance the success.

## PROGRAM GOALS

Develop programs by which gender equality and equity issues are addressed in society at large. Make women more educated about their rights in the society and make a society in which there are equal opportunities for women in every sector. Such programs work at grassroots levels and focus on providing to a select group of women who in turn will empower others and so on. Attain best possible results with available resources.

- 1. Provide personal safety education** to children of school going age so benefits are longer lasting. We can also create an environment where there will be lower chances of men being perpetrators of violence or bystanders when violence is occurring towards women. Work with NGOs in providing education about basic personal safety to older women including training about how to escape dangerous situations and how to fight back if there is need to.
- 2. Empower women** by using innovative approaches such as providing education in banking , personal finance , gender equality issues and personal safety education while providing them with training in livelihood skills. Provide them with tools to succeed such as providing seed money to start a trade, providing micro loans and providing market linkages. Provide appropriate equipment such as sewing machines, embroidery machines, cosmetology chairs, catering kits etc. in appropriate cases.
- 3. Empower women** by enhancing formation and continuation of self help groups by which empowered women help empower others and continue to enhance gender equality and equity in the society. Self help groups are known to be a very successful modality that has helped bring economic empowerment in various parts of the world.
- 4. Empower women** by providing them tools for self-development, character building and promoting and enhancing leadership skills
- 5. Involve men** wherever appropriate in the process to achieve mindset change in the entire society.

## Landmark Achievement: We Have Empowered Over 25,000 Women



*Gender equality training, for men as well as women, is a key component of our Women Empowerment program.*

The world keeps progressing and so do “WE” — to reduce and ultimately eliminate the struggle to empower marginalized women. We are taking strong, steady, and determined steps in partnership with NGOs in India that work at grassroots levels. Prior to funding, we encourage modification in the NGOs’ programs by applying proven, evidence-based methods, and we have gained significant success in administering such programs.

We are delighted to report that our expansion into various parts of India (including states such as Maharashtra, Gujarat, Rajasthan, West Bengal, and Jharkhand) have empowered over 25,000 women in just two and a half years. This is a significant landmark for all of us; however, we are not stopping. The latest statistics

show that even today, one girl under age 15 gets married every seven seconds, and 35% of women worldwide have experienced physical or sexual violence at some point in their lives. This gross violence, along with the substandard living conditions so many women endure, is not acceptable. Our mission is far from achieved and these numbers certainly call for enhanced efforts by all, including us.

Our experience indicates that focusing on certain aspects of women’s issues brings longer lasting results. For instance, a large gender gap in terms of both equality and equity is the most important aspect of women’s conditions in the world today. Lower levels of education, low levels of women’s access to paid employment, ideologies of male entitlement, and weak legal consequences for violence are some of the

complications that result from it. These are the same factors that are responsible for the high rate of violence towards women. We need to continue focusing on these key aspects and working vigorously to gain substantial results.

For any program to be successful, it must be multifaceted and address complementary areas, such as: women's education, gender equality training, personal safety education, livelihood skills training, character building, and

Share & Care has developed many customized programs that combine two or more such initiatives, and we have been successful in making significant impact at various levels of society, ultimately reaching the most remote and economically underdeveloped areas of India. PRADAN, WAVE, ISW, and ANJALI are the projects that work at grassroots levels and have successfully employed self-help groups to address the issues of livelihood skills, gender equality and equity education, and some leadership training. ARPAN addresses personal safety education as well as gender issues. RAMOLA BHAR and AVISHKAR focus on livelihood skills, personal safety, and gender equality within tribal populations. SMECT combines all of the approaches and in addition provides equipment related to the trade each beneficiary is trained in. Lastly, our project at Sabarmati Ashram continues to work with adolescent girls in combining formal education with early training in safety, gender equality, character building, and leadership skills.

They have also proven to be a successful way to empower women throughout different parts of the world, especially in developing countries. There is definite evidence that advocacy and empowerment counseling interventions help to prevent and reduce violence against women. These groups also train women in personal finance management, which is essential in order to achieve optimal economic empowerment.

We are consciously aware that many of our programs require continuous, long-term efforts. Changing the collective mindset of society is a particularly difficult task, and it is expected to take a long time, even with persistent work. But we are committed to it — and we are sure you are, too.

We appreciate all the support we have received from our patrons in reaching this significant landmark.

## Stories of Empowerment

### **Becoming a Catalyst for Positive Change**

Ms. Kailashi is a widowed housewife from the Tonk district of Rajasthan. After her husband passed away from an accident, she and her two school-age children went to live with her in-laws.



Kailashi is a member of a village-level peer group formed by our partner NGO. When she began attending the group, she was not aware of women's rights or about opportunities and laws created for women. Since attending the peer group, she has received training on these issues and was recently able to access government-funded socioeconomic welfare programs. She is now working to receive an inheritance from her family's property and is applying for a bank loan to open a small shop next to her home. She was also able to receive a government pension for widows, and has assisted her mother-in-law in accessing this same benefit. She is now determined to become self-sufficient and stays educated about new opportunities for women. By staying informed and sharing what she has learned with others, Kailashi has become a catalyst to bring about change in her society.

**Dola's Opportunity for a Better Future**

Dola lives in a small village of West Bengal with her family of five. Despite her father's job as a cycle van puller and her mother's job as a domestic worker, her family always lived in extreme poverty. They could not support her education, and Dola was married at the age of 13 to

a man who became abusive. After six years of unhappiness, she returned to her parents. Dola's deep interest in education became revived when she contacted one of our partner NGOs and expressed her desire to studying again. She started to attend a special education class and, with the NGO's support, Dola appeared for her final examination through the open school system. She also joined a skill development program focused on home nursing and home management, eventually gaining a job as a nursing assistant. She now lives a happy life with dignity and confidence.●

"My daughter signed me up for this race as a Father's Day gift!" George Craig, our 2nd place Make a Difference 5K winner, exclaimed.

Mr. Craig described how he had flown in from Ireland several hours before, stayed at a local hotel, picked up a car, and set his Maps app to Overpeck Park, our race venue. His daughter had read about Share & Care from Ireland and decided to register her dad for the race. He was amazed at Share & Care's philanthropic work and explained that educating impoverished children was especially important to him. I was astounded that a tourist to America who had no Indian connection was so deeply inspired to help "Make a Difference" in India.

The previous day, a park visitor approached us while we were setting up for the event. She was intrigued by the Share & Care posters and wanted to know more. As it turned out, her child was autistic and she had written a book about how both of them worked together to overcome his difficulties. She showed up on race day, volunteered her books, and declared that all proceeds from sales would go to Share & Care. Once again, this random act of generosity from an absolute stranger reiterated

what that day was about. Our new well-wisher was also determined to "Make a Difference."





## Total Cash Donations




## 2018 Revenue & Support






