 Confidence: Many students are
 noticeably shy when entering the
 program; however, based on our
 reports, more than three quarters of
 beneficiaries choose to participate
 in planned E2S social activities.
 These simple and fun interactions
 have positive effects on the
 students' ability to develop
 friendships and other healthy
 relationships.
- Advances Autonomy & Independence for Young Women: Statewide, the average marrying age for girls is 17. For female E2S



beneficiaries, the average age is 19–20. These educated young women will help to create a permanent cultural change in their families and communities.

3. Develops Leadership Skills: E2S beneficiaries are given tools to become mentors and role models. Through classroom presentations and student-led lessons, children are encouraged to showcase their individual talents and learn how to share knowledge with their peers.
