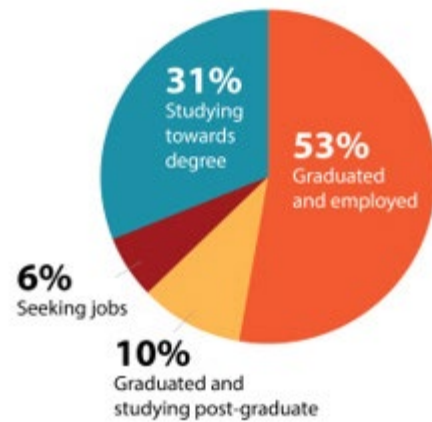
Learn About Our Educate to Graduate Program

The Educate to Graduate program began as a loan program in 2007 and has evolved into a scholarship program designed to give financial support to students who have shown their desire and ability to earn a college degree but cannot afford the tuition. E2G is conducted in several regions throughout India, including Gujarat where we're working with the NGO Higher Education Support Trust, and in Tamil Nadu, where we're working with the NGO Kalanjyam.

E2G has been a consistent success for Share & Care, delivering repeatable results and measurable outcomes. So far 1,614 scholars have graduated,

more than half of which (850) are gainfully employed and earning an average salary of \$6,500. That's an average of three times that of their family income! For the 2019-2020 school year, 73 students were enrolled, with 65 more in the current school year. COVID-19 has interfered with school openings, among other things, but we have responded with additional skill development training to help ensure successful graduates.

Meet the Beneficiaries

Saranya is from Tirukazhukundram in the Kancheepuram district and is the youngest of three daughters. She set her goals on reaching a high level of education like her older sisters, but her family ran into a severe financial crisis. Trapped by overwhelming debt, Saranya felt she was destined to immediately find a job and abandon her dreams of a college education.

Bhautik had decided on an engineering degree when he applied to Dhirubhai Ambani Institute of Information and Communication Technology, but it wasn't until after he was accepted that it became clear his family could not afford it. Bhautik's father only earns 85,000 rupees (US \$1,152.96) yearly, which was barely more than a third of the annual tuition his son needed.



Chitra comes from poor beginnings, and has a father who struggles with alcoholism and rarely works. Despite the hardships she has faced, she has chosen mechanical engineering as her profession. She hopes to encourage other young girls to choose their path based on their interests, not cultural expectations.
