

Infant Mortality Rate




Average deaths per 1,000 live births, per year (2010)

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
Infant Mortality Rate India

Areas such as **Rajasthan** as high as **80**



Some Proven Facts



Infant Mortality Rate*

Ranges from **62** in Madhya Pradesh to **10** in Goa (average 47)

Institutional Deliveries %

Ranges from **100%** in Kerala to **12%** in Nagaland (average for India is **41%**)

Vaccination Coverage %

Ranges from **81%** in Tamilnadu to **32%** in Assam

Literacy Rate %

Ranges from **100%** in Kerala to **58%** Jharkhand


Maternal Mortality Rate**

Ranges from **390** in Assam to **81** in Kerala (India overall 212)

**Infant Mortality Rate (IMR) measures death rate during the first year of life per 1,000 **Maternal Mortality Rate (MMR) measures number of women aged 15-49 years dying due to maternal causes per 100,000 live births*

Mission:

To improve basic comprehensive, primary healthcare of women and young children focusing on illness prevention and health education in the socioeconomically-challenged rural/semi-urban areas having little or no infrastructure.



Decisive Factors

for Healthcare 2 Unreached

- High infant mortality rate
- High maternal mortality rate
- Low rate of institutional deliveries
- Low immunization rate
- No healthcare center
- Low literacy rate
- High rural/semi-urban population
- Low income levels



Key Criteria

for Healthcare 2 Unreached



Infant Mortality

60 or more deaths per **1,000** live birth.

Immunization

50% or less of those **under age 5**

Literacy Rate

65% or less

Healthcare Facility

None **within 5 miles**, hospital **within 10 miles**

Education

65% or more women, **7th grade education or less**

Rural/Semi-Urban

60% or more of population

Infrastructure

Predominantly mud access roads




